

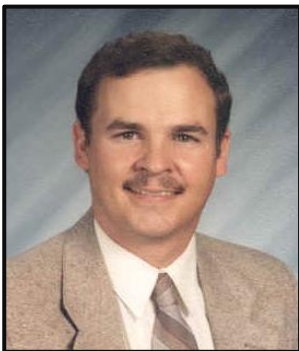

This workshop will discuss: (a) the importance of non-manual expressions for ASL; (b) the functions of non-manual expressions (grammatical signals, intonation, modifiers, independent signs and backchannel feedback); (c) some bicultural misunderstandings of non-manual expressions between deaf culture and general American culture (hearing people); (d) the importance and function of backchannel feedback's four categories to stimulate and continue communication between ASL signers; (e) the interpretations of non-manual components involving various body parts; (f) inflection degree and manipulation with mouth movement and eye signals; and (g) some external influences (age, gender, ethical culture, location and who).
