Basic

This workshop will focus on the basics: Understanding what is signed; paraphrasing what was signed; choosing appropriate English words to convey the meaning and intent and BEGINNING to put it all together. There will be a power point presentation, discussion, examples and practice opportunities for each area. Participants will have an opportunity to evaluate their current skills and develop a plan for improving their ability to voice interpret.

Mid-Range

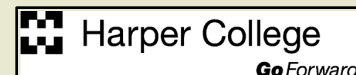
This workshop will provide opportunity for participants to practice voice interpreting in a safe environment. After discussing some helpful tips about voice interpreting the participants will work in small groups and provide feedback for each other. Participants will then have opportunities to demonstrate their voice interpreting skills and receive additional feedback from the instructor. Participants will be encouraged to evaluate their current skills and develop a plan for improving their ability to voice interpret

Advanced

This workshop is designed for interpreters who are able to voice interpret successfully but know there is room for improvement. A variety of source material will be provided: children, adults, ASL users, Signed English users. Interpreters will have an opportunity to work in small groups and also with the instructor to develop greater proficiency in voice interpreting. Interpreters will fill out a self evaluation and write their own goals for continuing to improve their skills. The group will discuss ways to continue practicing and the possibility of future workshops, classes or mentoring opportunities.
