

Civil Law - Legal Interpreting



This workshop will give a detailed explanation of the areas covered under the category of "Civil Litigation". This workshop is ideal for working interpreters that are thinking about entering the area of legal interpreting or interested in obtaining more information about it. Some background knowledge about this topic would be helpful but is not required. Discussion and demonstration of legal vocabulary as well as ethical issues that arise in this setting will be addressed. *Criminal matters will not be discussed.*

Participants will reach objectives thru some lecture and demonstration of specific vocabulary as well as discussion of policies, procedures and ethics. Handouts of the power point will be provided along with additional materials and articles pertinent to the topic.
